In April we celebrated Easter, we reflected on the suffering of Jesus and then we rejoiced in His glorious resurrection and so we move on to May and this is an interesting month. I find that May can be a challenge for the Christian, the time between Easter and the next celebration of Pentecost and then the long wait until Christmas, but we do have a lot to think about and celebrate in May. In the Christian calendar, we celebrate the Ascension of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, this year it lands on the 25 May.

Ascension Day is one of the earliest Christian festivals dating back to the year 68 AD. According to the New Testament in the Bible, Jesus Christ met several times with his disciples during the 40 days after his resurrection to instruct them on how to carry out his teachings. It is believed that on the 40th day he took them to the Mount of Olives, where they watched as he ascended to heaven.

Ascension Day marks the end of the Easter season and occurs ten days before Pentecost. Depending upon the phases of the Moon in a particular year, Ascension Day is usually celebrated on a Thursday.<sup>1</sup>

As Christians we should be looking up during May, why? Jesus has risen, He is alive and we celebrate Him rising upwards to rejoin His and our Heavenly Father. That allows us to go about our lives with heads held high, with the celebration of Easter fresh in our hearts, allowing us to walk in joy and faith. For many it will mean climbing their own mountains in life as Ascension can also refer to climbing up something, the Disciples had a mountain to climb after Jesus walked, talked and ate with them before He ascended in glory back to heaven. They like us have to think now on how we can carry our Jesus' instructions, how are we going to carry out His teachings and most importantly how are we going to live our lives accordingly?

The answer is simple, we walk with Christ each day, living our lives in trust and through our shared fellowship and prayers we will make a difference to our lives and those around us. So let me encourage you now my friends to walk in faith for He is risen indeed and has ascended on high where He has a place set aside for us at His banqueting table.

## "The Prayer Tree"

We believe that prayer is an important element of Christian life and worship.

"The Prayer Tree" on the alter is a way of saying a silent prayer to God using different coloured ribbons, each with a different meaning: Sometimes, we are not able to find the words or we would prefer anonymity just the fact that adding to the tree is all that is needed.

PURPLE is for praising God

YELLOW is for thanking God

RED is for asking God to help

**BLUE** is for saying sorry

WHITE is a prayer for peace



Choose a piece of coloured ribbon from the basket nearby, tie it to a branch as a prayer to God.

When the tree is full, ribbons will be removed and placed back in the basket for future use. One ribbon of each colour will be left on the tree to symbolise the payers made.

**LEAVES** can be used for a message or a request for prayers for a specific Person, Family, Country, Disaster, Group, Organisation, pets or anything you would like.

The leaves will be taken off the tree, every 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday and during the service when prayers are said these details will be offered.

Alternatively prayer requests can be put in an email or telephone call, or letter.
